- December 5 8:00 p.m.


Handel's *Messiah*

Missions Report

Dear Family & Friends,

Hello again from Zambia. Thank you for your continued prayers. We especially thank you for your recent prayers concerning our water. It continues to be very challenging. The water company borrowed a hose from the fire brigade and filled our tank. They did this upon request by Sean and Shannon. Then the next day there was enough city water pressure to run water up into our reserve tank. We haul water in from our outside faucet (city water) and try to keep three trash cans (water cans for us) filled in the house. The water that runs in the house comes only from the reserve tank. We are thankful for the mornings that we have city water. Sometimes it will last a couple of hours. For the past two days though we have only been able to run about two liters from the city faucet. I tell you this to give you a little picture of one of the daily things we deal with.

With all of that said, I believe the Lord is preparing us to make the move out to the bush. I once heard a sermon preached by Chuck Swindoll when we were trying to discern if God was wanting us to move. He said that when God wants us to move, He will make it harder for us to stay than to go. So we are making plans to be out in the bush more than we are in Livingstone. We will soon begin work on our pavilion. It will have two kitchens, two bathrooms (Wow! with running water), two dining/living areas, and two storage rooms. Shannon has designed a layout that can be converted to one large kitchen and dining area for when we have outreach teams come later. We will be using this pavilion while we are building our homes. Of course, we will be sleeping in our safari tents. While we are working on the pavilion, we will be staying at a camp site at Mutemwa Lodge 15 minutes away. They have running water and bathrooms with a SHOWER! (we are so excited) The owners of the lodge are Gavin and Penny Johnson. They are a sweet Christian couple. They have three little girls Shan, Kayla, and Tammy, with whom our girls quickly made friends. They really enjoy spending time with them. We have also thoroughly enjoyed the times we have spent with Penny & Gavin. What a blessing from the Lord to have another Christian brother and sister just 15 minutes away. We have also met two International Mission Board Missionaries that are about two and half hours from our land. Their names are Daniel & Skye Scott. They let us all come and stay a week with them to train us in PILAT Program in Language Acquisition Techniques. This is a program that will hopefully help us learn to speak the language of the Lozi, which is Silozi (more about this later). Our visit with Daniel & Skye went great. We truly enjoyed the fellowship and will also be blessed to build a relationship with them for many years to come.

Sean and Shannon went on a teaching trip to the bush last week. They took three men from our church in Livingstone with them: Mr. Alfred Mumba, Mr. Alfred Sinyangwe (both are deacons), and Mr. Enoch Munjoma (who is Lozi). They had more teaching time on that trip than any in the past. They were also able to question the men that they have been teaching further to see if they are truly saved. Please continue praying for the Lord to save Vincent, Jethro, Evans, Clement, Masiye, Concelia (Dominic's wife), Chief Ilwendo, Godfrey (Dominic's father-in-law), Concelia's mother, and their families and many others. Pray also that we will be able to learn to speak Silozi so that we can better communicate with these and all who we will live among. We have begun the PILAT Lessons with Enoch (remember he's the Lozi man from our church) as our helper. It is very challenging.
